
## Open House Sign!



The Pollinator Garden is located adjacent to the entrance to National Cathedral School's Athletic Center, and includes signage designating it a pollinator-friendly spot.


The plants in the garden are labeled with signs that serve as educational tools and to provide ideas for your own pollinator-friendly garden.

We have installed bee tubes as nesting places for "stingless" Mason bees, and now the blooming plants are busy with local pollinators. The Monarda media (Purple Bergamot) in particular is growing vigorously and is joined by Agastache, Rudbeckia, Echinacea, and Amsonsia, among other plants.
