

Pan Statue and LeCompte Pedestal



Location: At the entrance to Shadow House – facing the Bishop’s Lawn

The bronze statue of Pan is made of bronze and sculpted by Edith Parsons. The statue was purchased by Mrs. Avery Coonley for her Cleveland Park house, “Rosedale,” during the 1920s. In the 1960s, it was given to the Cathedral by her daughter, Mrs. Waldron Faulkner, when “Rosedale” went out of the family.

The statue originally sat on a pedestal near the entrance to the Baptistry (during a period of time when it was the Herb Cottage shop). It now rests on a pedestal dedicated to Cathedral stained glass artist, Rowan LeCompte
